ANTIGONICK/ANTIGONE CHEAT SHEET

<u>Who is Antigone</u>? A major character from ancient Greek mythology. She is the daughter of King Oedipus, who (unknowingly) kills his own father and marries his own mother. Thus Antigone, her sister Ismene and their two brothers Eteokles and Polyneikes, are all children of incest.

<u>What is the play Antigone</u>? A tragic play first produced in 441 BCE, over 2,400 years ago, considered one of the greatest tragedies of all time.

<u>Who is Sophokles</u>? Famous author of Antigone and one of the great playwrights of ancient Athens. His most notable plays: Antigone, Oedipus the King (Oedipus Rex), and Oedipus at Colonus.

(*NOTE: We are using Anne Carson's spellings of English words translated from the ancient Greek language, rather than the more common spellings such as "Sophocles".)

<u>Who is Anne Carson</u>? Acclaimed poet and classicist (Canadian), famous for her highly innovative translations of ancient Greek plays.

<u>Who was Hegel</u>? (Georg Wilhelm Friedrich Hegel) Enormously influential 18th Century German philosopher, famous for his extensive interpretations and analyses of Sophokles' Antigone. His views of Antigone have been heavily interrogated by contemporary feminist thinkers, including Judith Butler.

<u>Who is Beckett</u>? (Samuel Beckett) Famous 20th Century Irish playwright, author of Waiting for Godot, whose tragicomedies feature bleak, existential despair mixed with dark humor.

<u>Who is Brecht</u>? (Bertolt Brecht) Legendary 20th Century German playwright, theater director, Marxist dramatic theorist, and poet. His adaptation of *Antigone* featured his wife Helene Weigel as Antigone carrying a heavy door-like contraption on her back. <u>Who is Oedipus</u>? Famous figure from Greek mythology and from Sophokles' play Oedipus the King. A Theban king who unknowingly marries his own mother and kills his own father, as prophesied by the gods. His children are Antigone, Ismene, Polyneikes, Eteokles.

<u>Why are the two brothers - Polyneikes and Eteokles - fighting at the</u> <u>beginning of our production of Antigonick</u>? They are battling over the throne of Thebes. Eteokles has refused to share his throne with Polyneikes. In retaliation, Polyneikes has now returned to attack Thebes after raising an army in neighboring Argos.

How do these two brothers die? They kill each other in battle at the very same moment, at one of the famous seven gates of Thebes.

<u>Who is Kreon</u>? Kreon is the new king of Thebes after the deaths of Polyneikes and Eteokles. He's the uncle of Antigone, Ismene, Polyneikes, and Eteokles.

Why do characters mention "seven gates"? Ancient Thebes was famous for its seven city gates.

<u>Who is "the man from Argos"</u>? A poetic description of the whole, massive Argive army raised by Polyneikes to attack Thebes. Thebes has recently defeated this army.

<u>Who is Zeus</u>? The supreme god in the ancient Greek pantheon of gods; God of thunder, lighting, law, order, justice.

<u>What is Mount Olympus</u>? Highest mountain in Greece; thought to be the home of the gods in ancient Greek mythology

<u>Who are Eros and Aphrodite</u>? In ancient Greek mythology, Eros was the god of erotic love, and the son of Aphrodite, goddess of love, beauty, pleasure, and procreation.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

It's been a challenging and wonderful adventure taking Anne Carson's Antigonick from page to stage in collaboration with our wonderful cast and production team over the past several weeks.

Although Carson calls Antigonick a "translation" from Sophokles-and in many ways it is a translation--one cannot help but see this work as a postmodern re-envisioning of the ancient Antigone by way of Carson's brilliant, contemporary mind.

Here are Carson's own words about her Antigonick:

"To be honest, I don't see any 'rewrite' going on. Everything I've done in the translation is an attempt to convey a move or shock or darkening that happens in the original text. This doesn't always mean reproducing the words and sentences of the original in their same order; but a play is (note etymology of 'drama' from Greek DRAN 'to do or act') a collection of actions or doings, this is what needs to be rendered from Greek into English. It's true Sophokles doesn't mention Hegel on the first page of Antigone, but he does refer to the long tradition of Antigone's catastrophic family in order to remind his Greek audience of the legend and for us, in 2012, the Antigone legend includes Hegel."

And you will indeed hear references to Hegel, Beckett, Brecht, and Virginia Woolf in Antigonick and you'll encounter other surprising anachronisms in this translation.

Another major characteristic of Antigonick: Carson's emphasis on the importance of time—and timing—in tragedy. The fate of each major character in Antigone is tied to the Greek concept of kairos, meaning "moment in time," "opportune moment," "the critical moment of opportunity," or "the nick of time," and thus does Carson include "nick" in the play's title and introduces an entirely new character into the play: the silent but ever present Nick.

Anne Carson (She/Her) was born in Canada. Her awards and honors include the Lannan Award, the Pushcart Prize, the Griffin Trust Award for Excellence in Poetry, a Guggenheim fellowship, and the MacArthur "Genius" Award.

MARTHA B. JOHNSON Director, Dramaturg

Martha B. Johnson (She/Her) is a stage director, dramaturg, and playwright, who is co-founder and Core Artist Leadership Member at Full Circle Theater. She's directed 40+ theater productions over her career in the Twin Cities, and is a longtime collaborator with Co-Artistic Director Rick Shiomi, both at Full Circle and at Theater Mu, where she was a co-founder and served as a Core Artist Group member for 21 years, and where she developed and directed several plays. 
numerous Minnesota high schools. He is also a violence

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






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About Full Circle Theater Company
